Scholarships to Note

Harry S. Truman

Are you planning on working in civil or public service? The Truman funds graduate school for students who plan to pursue a career in public service.

BYU Deadline: November 16, 2009.

Carnegie Endowment for International Peace—Junior Fellows Program

The fellows program allows graduating seniors the opportunity to be junior research fellows. The students will work with senior associates on international affairs issues. Includes \$2,750 a month plus insurance and a moving allowance.

BYU Deadline: December 7, 2009

National Institutes of Health: Graduate Partnerships Program

This program offers a PhD experience combined with extensive research in NIH labs. The award ranges from \$22,500 to \$31,800 depending on the program and year of study.

Deadline: December 15, 2009

Critical Language Scholarships for Intensive Summer Institutes

The U.S. State Department offers fully funded intensive overseas language study for Arabic, Bangla/Bengali, Hindi, Punjabi, Turkish, Urdu, Chinese, Korean, Persian, and Russian.

Deadline: December 18, 2009

Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship

The Goldwater Scholarship awards \$7,500 to sophomores and juniors majoring in science, mathematics, engineering or those who plan to pursue a research-based career.

Deadline: December 19, 2009

Institute for Humane Studies: Undergraduate/Graduate

This fellowship provides \$12,000 for students who have clearly demonstrated research interest in the intellectual and institutional foundations of a free society. Available for juniors, seniors and graduate students.

Deadline: December 31, 2009

National Defense Science & Engineering Fellowship

The NDSEF provides funding for students seeking a doctoral degree in science or engineering. Includes full tuition, required fees, minimum insurance coverage and a \$31,000 stipend.

Deadline: January 4, 2010

National Security Education Program Boren Awards: Undergraduate/Graduate

The NSEP offers from \$4000-\$30,000 for study abroad in areas that are critical to U.S. security interests: Africa, Asia, Eastern & Central Europe, Middle East, Latin America & the Caribbean.

Deadline: January 11, 2010
