RESEARCH OPPORTUNITIES:

Students may have the opportunity to work as research assistants to political science faculty. Some students are paid research or teaching assistants, and others receive mentored research credit. Mentored research credit can apply towards elective credit in the major.

INTERNSHIPS, CO-OP & PRACTICAL ED:

The Political Science Department offers internships in Washington D.C., with the Utah State Legislature, and with other state and local government entities. International mentored research and internship opportunities are also offered through the department.

HONORARY SOCIETIES AND CLUBS:

A chapter of Sigma Iota Rho (International Studies Honor Society) and the BYU Political Affairs Society (BYUPAS) are offered at BYU. BYUPAS is the official student organization of the BYU Political Science Department. BYUPAS is dedicated to serving students who have interests in applied politics and connecting them with alumni, faculty, and friends of the University. Members of BYUPAS automatically become members of the Beta Mu chapter of Pi Sigma Alpha, the national political science honor society. Go to http://byupas.org to join.

CAREERS:

The department has five specialized tracks that help students choose courses that support their desired career paths. Majors can choose a track to pursue and select from an array of courses within each track to satisfy the requirements of the track.

These tracks allow students to specialize in a particular area of Political Science. International Strategy and Diplomacy is designed for majors interested in international/comparativerelated careers such as diplomacy and risk analysis, and includes courses on comparative politics, international relations, national security, human rights, etc. Legal Studies is an ideal track for those interested in law school. Courses in the legal studies track include constitutional law, international law, and jurisprudence. The **Political Strategy** track may be an option for those interested in political and campaign management and features courses on topics such as campaigns and elections, the political role of the media, and state and local government. A fourth track, Research and **Analysis.** may be the choice of those interested in jobs in data science and related fields, or going on to graduate work in social sciences. It includes course electives in areas such as data visualization, survey research, experimental methods, and qualitative methods. The final track, Global **Development**, is an option particularly for students interested
